## A STORY-BASED METHODOLOGY: TEACHING ENGLISH TO 1<sup>ST</sup> AND 2<sup>ND</sup> GRADEF

This workshop aimed to focus on some basic principles a story-based teaching methodology, leading to a bette understanding of the role played by picture books in the contextualization of the language. Learning a foreign language should be a cognitively demanding task.

Story-telling helps young learners to become aware of sounds, stress and rhythm, aspects of intonation and pronunciation of the language, simultaneously allowing development of developing young learners' learning strategies by means of activities such as listening for general meaning, predicting, guessing meaning and hypothesizing.

Story-telling develops the different types of "intelligence that contribute to language learning, including emotion intelligence. The use of stories for the teaching of Englimay link language learning to other subjects of the curriculum, such as maths, science, arts and crafts, geography, technology, music and drama, thus contributing to the children's conceptual development.
